Thermostats

When you walk in to the kitchen, the freestanding thermostat will be on the work surface. Feel free to adjust it to be comfortable, but please don't turn it below 17 degrees. The radiators in your room are fitted with a thermostat, please adjust them to your requirements.



Pots and Pans

The pots and pans are in the bottom cupboard to the left of the dishwasher, plates & bowls are in the drawer above.

Trash bags are kept underneath the sink, (you'll find other basic cleaning supplies like sponges, bleach, and dish soap there as well) also in the cupboards in the utility room

Bedroom 2 (Front Bedroom)

There is a hair dryer in your bedside cabinet

Things to do

Cowley Tunnel



Pleasant walks can be enjoyed along the canal towpath, and by the Boat Inn, there is a ramp giving access to everyone including wheelchair users. If you head north towards Norbury Junction you will enjoy lovely views across to Shropshire from the impressive Shelmore embankment. Walking south you will pass through Cowley tunnel, which is unusual in being cut through solid rock and not brick-lined. If you leave the towpath at the end of the cutting (there is a ramped access on the far side of the bridge) you can enjoy walking back along paths through the woods above the cutting. One side is known as the Kingfisher Trail and some work has been carried out to create a length of accessible path. The old railway line is also available for walking with easy access off the A518 opposite the fish and chip shop (close to the Royal Oak). It can also be accessed up steps from the towpath to the north of Gnosall. If you walk along to the west you will nearly reach Newport. The route is pleasant and runs between fields, with nice views.

The Kingfisher Trail

Cowley Cutting, Wood Eaton & The Kingfisher Trail: About 1 hour 30 mins)
From the Boat Inn cross the bridge over the Canal, and climb over the stile on your left to descend to the towpath. Walk along the towpath in a Southerly direction, with the 3 story houses of Waterside Court and then the wooden Norwegian style bungalows to your left. Through Cowley Tunnel, and continue through the cutting with steep banks on either side.
Continuing along the towpath, beneath Cowley Bridge (No 32) and then beneath two further bridges (No's 31 and 30) until you approach another bridge (No 29), this is Wood Eaton Bridge.

As you near the bridge climb the path to your right up onto the lane, and turn right. After about half a mile you reach a T junction of lanes, Gnosall indicated to your right. Turn right towards Gnosall, passing a lone house on your right and Lower Cowley Farm on your left, until you reach the Canal.

Do not descend to the towpath but cross the bridge, and then go through the gate on your left immediately after the bridge. Follow this path which climbs high above the canal which will be on your left. This is part of the Kingfisher Trail, Continue along this path (take care if looking over the side to the canal as the edge is very high and unprotected), until you reach its junction with Quarry Lane. At the time of writing there is no proper gate onto the lane.

Once on Quarry Lane, turn left and follow the lane above the Cowley Canal tunnel, until you see a farm ahead of you and some houses on your right. Follow the bend in the lane round to the right and continue to the junction with the Gnosall to Moreton and Outwoods road. At this junction, turn right and cross the canal bridge by the Boat Inn to return to your starting point.

Gnosall

A Little about Gnosall

Gnosall (pronounced Knowsall) is a large village on the A518 between Stafford and Newport Shropshire. It has a thriving community with a primary school a variety of services (doctors, vets, hairdressers) and shops.

It is a village of two halves having been split by the railway and low lying land.

The old village centre contains a large church, (St Lawrence), High St, old village lock-up & Village Hall. Many old cottages & houses survive in this area especially on the High Street, including a thatched one which used to be a pub.

The old primary school in the High Street is now used as meeting rooms. Gnosall Heath lies to the south of the A518. Its main attraction is the Shropshire Union canal which is a conservation area.

The Methodist Chapel is also at this end of the village.

A former chapel at the junction of the A518 and Mill Lane has been converted to a house. The old mill lies diagonally opposite it.

There is a village bakery in Wharf Road. Pleasant walks can be enjoyed along the canal towpath, and by the Boat Inn, there is a ramp giving access to everyone including wheelchair users.

If you head north towards Norbury Junction you will enjoy lovely views across to Shropshire from the impressive Shelmore embankment. Walking south you will pass through Cowley tunnel, which is unusual in being cut through solid rock and not brick-lined.

If you leave the towpath at the end of the cutting (there is a ramped access on the far side of the bridge) you can enjoy walking back along paths through the woods above the cutting.

One side is known as the Kingfisher Trail and some work has been carried out to create a length of accessible path.

Staffordshire

What to see and do in Staffordshire

Staffordshire is a landlocked county in the West Midlands. It borders Cheshire to the northwest, Derbyshire and Leicestershire to the east, Warwickshire to the southeast, the West Mids County and Worcestershire to the south, and Shropshire to the west.

The largest settlement in Staffordshire is Stoke-on-Trent, which is administered as an independent unitary authority, separately from the rest of the county. Lichfield is a cathedral city. Other major settlements include Stafford, Burton upon Trent, Cannock, Newcastle-under-Lyme, Rugeley, Leek, and Tamworth.

Other towns include Stone, Cheadle, Uttoxeter, Hednesford, Brewood, Burntwood/Chasetown, Kidsgrove, Eccleshall, Biddulph and the large villages of Penkridge, Wombourne, Perton, Kinver, Codsall, Tutbury, Alrewas, Barton-under-Needwood, Shenstone, Featherstone, Essington, Stretton and Abbots Bromley. Cannock Chase AONB is within the county as well as parts of the National Forest and the Peak District national park.

Apart from Stoke-on-Trent, Staffordshire is divided into districts of Cannock Chase, East Staffordshire, Lichfield, Newcastle-under-Lyme, South Staffordshire, Stafford, Staffordshire Moorlands, and Tamworth.
